Ian McKay

Ian McKay is a Canadian historian at Queen's University, where he has taught since 1988. His primary interests are Canadian cultural and political history; the economic and social history of Atlantic Canada, especially Nova Scotia, in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. McKay's *Reasoning Otherwise: Leftists and the People's Enlightenment in Canada, 1890-1920* won the prestigious Sir John A. McDonald Prize, awarded by the *Canadian Historical Association* for the best book written in Canadian history in 2009.
