Description:	<p>Hakikazi Catalyst is a non-profit, non-political and non-religious organization committed to social and economic justice in Tanzania. Its vision is of a Tanzania where poor people are empowered with knowledge and skills to generate an active and effective voice with which to influence pro-poor policy decisions and hence achieve sustainable livelihoods.</p> <p>Four Saint Mary's students and a Saint Mary's IDS professor spent several months (including two weeks in Tanzania) to assist the Tanzanian NGO to develop an effective monitoring and evaluation (M&E) system for their activities in Northern Tanzania. After reviewing current M&E practices within the organizations, the students, with the assistance of the professor, designed and delivered a one-day M&E workshop for Hakikazi staff and developed a draft M&E manual.</p> <p>The project not only provided some useful training and consulting services to the Tanzanian NGO, it also gave the students a wonderful opportunity to experience first-hand how it feels to be a consultant in the international development context.</p>
