<b>Description:</b>	Project management training may entail a broad-based overview of tools used throughout the project cycle, or may focus specifically on functions such as project design, proposal writing, resource management, report writing and project communications, monitoring and evaluation.

Programs have been designed for participants to:

- better use the primary tools of project management (e.g. Logical Framework, Work Breakdown Structure, Timelines)
- design successful project activities and to ensure effective implementation, monitoring, and sustainability
- work in collaboration to draft project documents
- design and implement an evaluation of an international development project

The training methodology is interactive. Participants are actively encouraged to participate in discussions, either within smaller groups or in plenary. Case studies form an important part of learning process, as does the sharing of experiences by the facilitator and among participants.
