

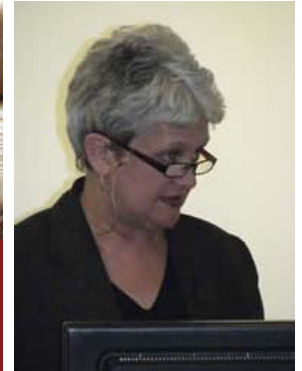

**AS FUNDRAISING** for Haitian relief continues, University president Colin Dodds announced that the administration will match all monies raised by Saint Mary's University Student Association up to \$5000. Late last week SMUSA president Matt Anderson said \$3,000 had already been raised and he was hopeful that an addition \$2000 would be donated by February 12 when student unions from across the province agreed to compare campus fundraising totals.
