





Money matters

Saint Mary's University rewards academic excellence with \$5 million dedicated to student scholarships annually. As a high school student, if your application is received by March 15, you will be automatically assessed for an entrance scholarship. Students who apply after March 15 will be considered for entrance scholarships as resources permit. We also reward continuous improvement. You may be eligible for a higher valued scholarship, or a new scholarship, should your admission average increase by July 31.

Study and work in Canada

Prior to arriving in Canada, international students are required to obtain a study permit and, depending on your country of citizenship, a temporary resident visa issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada. Visit www.cic.gc.ca for specific information for your country of origin. International students who want to gain experience and income, are permitted to work while studying, and remain in Canada for up to three years after graduation. ESTIMATED COST

It's important to keep in mind what kind of expenses you can expect when you attend university. Of course there's tuition, but be sure to consider costs like residence and meal plans, too. Here's some information to help you estimate potential costs.

Admission requirements

For admission, five senior-level academic courses with an overall average of 70%, with no mark below 60%, or equivalent, is required. Admission requirements vary between degrees. While there is no deadline, we encourage you to apply early.

If you have completed IB, AP or, A Level courses, you may be eligible to receive undergraduate credit. Please visit www.smu.ca/futurestudents for more information.

Language requirements

Students whose first language is not English may be required to provide proof of their proficiency, for example:

- A minimum of 80 overall on the iBT TOFEL with no individual band below 20;
- A minimum score of 6.5 on the IELTS with no individual score below 6.0;
- An average of 4.5 on the CanTEST with no individual score below 4;
- CAEL overall band of 60 with no individual band below 50;
- University of Cambridge ESOL Examinations CAE with a grade of A, B, or C or;
- Pearson PTE score of 58

Saint Mary's will offer a conditional acceptance to academically qualified students who have not submitted a test score. A conditional acceptance can help you obtain your study permit.

On campus English as a second language programs (TESL Centre)

Many students whose first language is not English begin their studies at Saint Mary's University TESL Centre. Students who successfully complete the highest level of the English for Academic Proposes (EAP) program may be admitted to undergraduate studies without a written language examination. For students who are at an advanced level in English language, a University Bridging program (UBP) is offered. This program allows students to take one or two undergraduate courses alongside the English training program. Please contact the TESL Centre for more information. tesl@smu.ca


