

THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The ceremonial mace, carried by the Marshal of Convocation, was presented to Saint Mary's University in 1980. It symbolizes the University's authority to grant degrees and is a gift from Maritime Command in honour of alumni killed in both world wars. The mace also recognizes serving members of the Canadian Armed Forces who have been students at Saint Mary's.

The mace is made of oak with a cast brass crown and brass plates carrying traditional ceremonial engravings; the plates represent the contributions to Saint Mary's by the Jesuit Fathers, the Christian Brothers of Ireland, the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Halifax-Yarmouth, the LaSalle Christian Brothers, the Lay Teachers and the Armed Forces.

It is a call for dedication, a focus on duty and perseverance, a statement of process. It is a proclamation of the importance of disciplining ourselves to our studies, to our scientific, artistic, cultural, commercial and athletic pursuits. It is a call to action to act in the world, to shoulder responsibility, to champion social justice, environmental justice and ethical values.

Flags on the Stage

The flags that you see displayed on the stage for Convocation are from the countries representing our graduating students. The globalization of the Saint Mary's University community is a feature of justifiable pride that contributes markedly to the growth and understanding of both Canadian and non-Canadian students.



Included in the university's permanent collection of flags is one from the International Year of the Disabled signifying the university's commitment to people with disabilities. The Mi'kmaq flag is an important part of this collection in recognition of their First Nation's Status. The university's Bicentennial flag was made a part of our permanent collection in 2002.

Academic Hoods

Graduates and members of the academic procession are attired in the basic elements of formal academic dress, which follow general guidelines established at England's Oxford and Cambridge Universities. It consists of the academic robe, hood and mortar board (at Saint Mary's, the latter is limited to Master's graduates).

The academic hood symbolizes the degree into which each graduate has been admitted, its outer edge trimmed with a color to indicate a particular Faculty and degree: white symbolizes Arts; gold, Science; grey, Commerce, and green for Environmental Studies. Bachelor–level hoods are lined with satin in the colours of the institution granting the degree. Hence at Saint Mary's, they are maroon satin with a white chevron. The Master's hood is lined with maroon satin only, giving it added distinction.

President's Award for Excellence in Research

Dr. Danika van Proosdij

An international leader in her field and established pioneer in the implementation of nature-based solutions for climate change adaptation, Dr. Danika van Proosdij has dedicated almost three decades to finding and promoting naturebased solutions to prevent coastal erosion. In the past six years Dr. van Proosdij has received \$15.8M in direct research funding from federal and international agencies.



Dr. van Proosdij's ability to embrace challenges from the individual through to the planetary scale is what sets her apart. Her work is collaborative, crossdisciplinary and transboundary between biophysical and social sciences; her efforts to address the effects of climate change on ecosystems and ultimately human systems will have a vital impact on the ecosystem in Nova Scotia and beyond.

With a willingness to generously share her knowledge, Dr. van Proosdij has provided a stimulating training environment for 136 highly qualified personnel, from undergraduate to postgraduate levels. She has authored more than 42 papers and 105 technical reports, and has given 200+ presentations around the world.

Dr. van Proosdij earned her PhD in Biophysical Processes and Environmental Analysis from the University of Guelph. She has been a professor of Geography at Saint Mary's since 2001, is also the Director of the TransCoastal Adaptations Centre for Nature-Based Solutions and was recently elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada.

The President's Award for Excellence in Research honours continued exceptional contributions to research and scholarship conducted by a full-time Saint Mary's University faculty member. More information can be found at smu.ca/fgsr/presidents-award.

Stanley (Stan) James Hartling, Doctor of Commerce, honoris causa

Stan Hartling BComm'86, CEO and founder of the Hartling Group is an entrepreneur, business leader and philanthropist. Under Stan's leadership, the Hartling Group has grown to become one of the largest employers within the Turks and Caicos Islands with over 800 employees. The Hartling Group's three luxury resorts have received the industry's highest awards for design and excellence and are valued at over \$500 million. The Group also has interests in large-scale construction and advertising and owns one of the largest private yacht charter operations in the Caribbean. Stan has been recognized as Developer of the Year by *Caribbean World* and *Living Magazine*.



Stan Hartling's strong values infuse his companies and the wider community. In 2021, Stan received the Humanitarian of the Year Award from the Turks and Caicos Human Rights Commission for his extensive and generous charitable contributions. He received the Pandemic Icon Award for humanitarian efforts and employee support during the 2020 shutdowns. Stan was recognized as Philanthropist of the Year by the United Way and inducted into the Filipino Basketball Hall of Fame for significant contributions to the sport. Stan is founding director of "Boys to Men", a mentorship organization for youth.

The Hartling Group has raised over \$2 million for local charitable organizations and scholarship programs including the Cancer Foundation, United Way, Kidney Foundation and Salvation Army. Stan is Honorary Chairman of the Salvation Army, Turks and Caicos Islands, a 20-year member of the Board of Trustees for the National Museum and Honorary Director of the Turks and Caicos Aids Awareness Foundation.

In 2022, Stan created the Stan Hartling Scholarship which provides financial support to youth from Turks and Caicos, allowing them the opportunity to attend Saint Mary's University. His passion is to be able to mentor and inspire youth to pursue entrepreneurial careers.

Kapil Sahni Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research



Kapil is a confident, curious, self-driven and kind-hearted person. He believes in striving for continuous improvement in oneself both on the personal and professional front. 


