MINOR IN CULTURE, RACE and RESISTANCE

The Minor is based on a diverse range of courses exploring forms of cultural resistance related to race, ethnicity, gender, nationalism, globalization, social justice and activism. Students study literature from transnational, translocal, and interdisciplinary perspectives, while investigating postcolonial, anti-colonial, black and Indigenous approaches and texts.

Prerequisite: Three (3) credit hours in ENGL at the 1000 level
