



## **JOB POSTING INTERNATIONAL MASTER OF TEACHING ENGLISH PROGRAM (IMTE)**

The new International Master of Teaching English program (IMTE) based in the Faculty of Education, invites applications for a three-year contract position in the Lecturer Stream rank to begin on July 1, 2022. This position will play a key role in developing the IMTE program which is offered exclusively to international students who are non-native speakers of English. The successful candidate will receive a cross-appointment to a relevant secondary unit, to be determined at the time of appointment. Candidates must hold a Doctoral degree in a field directly related to educational linguistics and/or teaching English as a Second/Foreign/Additional Language. Candidates should also demonstrate a track record of leadership and success in digital learning environments and remote course delivery strategies such as hybrid, dual-mode, web-based and synchronous or asynchronous instruction. The position includes responsibilities related to language teacher education, teacher professional development, curriculum development, student advising, and program support. Experience in collaborative teaching and research with partner institutions in international settings is expected. Salary will be determined according to the regular Lecturer scale described in the Collective Agreement with the Saint Mary's University Faculty Union (SMUFU).
