Once completed, the form must be emailed to Saint Mary's University Diversity and Inclusion Advisor, Ms. Deborah Brother-Scott (deborah.brothers-scott@smu.ca). Section I of this form is mandatory and relates to citizenship. Saint Mary's University must comply with federal government requirements regarding recruitment of foreign academics and give priority to qualified Canadian citizens and permanent residents, whether in Canada or abroad. Section II is the voluntary self-identification information. The chair of the search committee only confirms the applicants' Canadian citizenship/permanent residency status with Ms. Brother-Scott.
