

Getting Started

Eureka is a database that provides access to full-text content from over **60,000 worldwide news sources**, including daily newspapers, websites, radio, television, social media, and more. Dates of coverage and access vary depending on the source.

Searching with Eureka

Eureka’s basic search is similar to Google, a single search box for entering keywords. Once you have selected your keywords, you can filter your search by date (from today, last 7 days, last year, etc.) and by content (e.g., All content, Canadian English, Canadian French, Europe, websites and blogs, etc.).

Search results will include a title or headline, partial abstract, publication date, and source of publication. You can filter you results by news medium, such as “Press”, “Television and Radio”, or other options provided at the top of the search results page.

Advanced Searching with Eureka

To use Eureka to its full advantage, the “Advanced Search” function offers more search and filter options. Here, you will use keywords, but can employ Boolean operators (“AND,” “OR,” and “WITHOUT”) to modify your results. You can specify where you would like to search for the keywords (such as “anywhere in the text,” “in the author name,” or “in the lead”). As well, additional filters allow you to search within specific groups of sources or specify source criteria or a particular source name.

Filtering by source criteria allows you to tailor searches by specific news mediums, language, frequency of publication, topics, and by geographical coverage or geographical origin. Advanced searches require more attention to search criteria, but can lead to results that better suit your needs.

Working with Search Results

When you have found an article that you would like to save or print, click on the title to view the record. If a full-text file is available, select the Download icon () or Print icon () to access the file.

Clicking on the download icon will provide you with the option to export to PDF or RIS format. Select the RIS Format if you want to save the file for uploading to RefWorks or another citation manager.

If you would like to save multiple articles at once, select the articles from the Search Results page, and then click on the corresponding icon to download or print. Results saved to PDF will be downloaded as ONE (1) PDF DOCUMENT, so only use this function if you are okay with saving multiple articles to one file.



As you browse through search results, you can also use the pin icon () to select documents for later viewing. Pinned documents will be deleted at the end of your session, so be sure to view and download/print your pinned documents before closing your browser.

Examining Full News Sources in *PDF Section*

Eureka offers a PDF section where you can look at complete newspaper publications, rather than individual articles. There are local, national and international news sources that you can click on and review in-browser. Availability of the latest issue varies depending on the source, though most publications provide access to recent issues. You can navigate to this section by clicking on "PDF Section" in the Eureka navigation bar at the top of the page, and either search by keyword for a specific publication or click through an alphabetical list to find the publication you want.
