



New Programs/Changes:

- Approved over last year (SMU & MPHEC), and recruiting for first Cohort in Fall 2024:
 - MAHSR-P ... 12-month course-based online program (delivered jointly with UNB/MUN/UPEI); parallels existing thesis option
- Approved at SMU (going to MPHEC now):
 - Online stream of MSc I/O Psycholgy (same content/requirements as existing in-person program)
 - Online Graduate Diploma in Personnel Psychology
- An idea well-advanced and being developed:
 - MSc in Engineering and Industrial Management

Updated Thesis Processes & Policies

To ensure consistency across programs for the process and experience of thesis defences, and supervision, and following discussions/consultations over past year(s) with grad program coordinators

The following items related to thesis defences, and committees are in place:

- Allowing defences to be either in-person, virtual, or hybrid
- All defences will be Chaired by an FGSR-appointed delegate:
 - we've created a "College of Defence Chairs" volunteer faculty who are prepared to be called upon to Chair
 - more volunteers always welcomed!
- Thesis defences are all "open to public" unless special exemption request is made (all public observers are to only observe no questions of candidate from anyone except for committee, as part of the defence)
- Have updated forms to clarify timing and process of contacting External Examiner, and managing their pre-defence report (who gets it, when)
 - have separated (if desired) request to get external examiner approved, and request to schedule defence (mostly a PhD issue)

Updated Thesis Processes & Policies

Updated Graduate Regulation 16(d): requires formation of supervisory committees, and specifies timing

d. In Master programs that require a thesis, a student shall normally be established within eight (8) months of starting the program. For Ph.D. programs, the supervisory committee should normally be established within the first twelve (12) months of the program or by the time that the student has completed their comprehensive exams. Supervisory committees require approval of the relevant Graduate Program Coordinator (GPC) and the Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research and shall consist of at least a thesis supervisor and one other member for the Master level, and at least a thesis supervisor and two other members for the Ph.D. level. Requirements to serve as a thesis supervisor are outlined below in Regulation 16 (e)

- Have also changed Graduate Academic Reg. 16 (e) to speak to situations around Adjunct supervisors, and "co-supervisors":
 - Clarified that committees must have at least one SMU full-time faculty member (when external Adjuncts are supervisor, a SMU member will be identified as "internal advisor")
 - Clarified that co-supervision should be rare/exceptional, and require Dean's approval (so: not prohibited, just reviewed to ensure/understand the best support for the student and/or faculty supervisor)

Last Graduate Student notes:

- We are planning to start holding "brown-bag lunch discussions" in the area of student supervision & mentoring
 - First one will be early next semester, and will focus on supervising undergraduate student employees/researchassistants. (this is collaboration of FGSR, Career Services, and People & Culture)
 - Then we will follow with graduate supervision and committee membership (mentoring roles)
- REMINDER: new direct-application method for students currently applying for grad programs (to start next year): https://www.smu.ca/durlandscholarships/index.html
 - New students must apply by January 31
 - And must have completed their application to their grad program of choice also by January 31
 - Ensure all of your "top applicants" are aware.





- Review status, supports from SMU, develop MOAs to confirm/formalize supports (such as they can be)
- Assist and confirm how to ensure maximum benefit from SMU association (e.g. brand compliance, webpage, etc)
- We were able to secure a good donation (\$3M) to allow renaming of CSSH to the McCain & McClean Centre for Sport, Busines and Health – that Centre's activities have been dramatically enhanced.
- And new TCA Centre has had very successful year(s)!

- the process for applying for contracts, and getting assistance/support is outlined now more clearly, including ensuring early connection with Office of Innovation and Comm Engagement (OICE) within FGSR
- other notable updates/changes to the Policy:
 - Simplified policy for university required charge for "overhead" (indirect cost of research) ... now: minimum is flat rate of 20% of total direct research costs
 - The use (or distribution) of this collected overhead now includes re-directing a
 portion back for use by the professor holding the contract (20% of the collected
 overhead is re-directed back this way to the PI)

Research Data Management:

- Federal Tri-Agencies *have* moved forward on implementing a national Research Data Management Policy (https://www.science.gc.ca/eic/site/063.nsf/eng/h 547652FB.html)
- Next steps:
 - Inclusion of Research Data Management (RDM) Plans will be required on selected grant program applications
 - By March 2023: all universities will need to have public RDM Institutional Strategies (to remain eligible for TriAgency funding)
- Assistance locally with RDM experts in Library Peter Webster (lead)
- National Portage portal: Data Management Planner Assistant (https://portagenetwork.ca/tools-and-resources/dmp-assistant/)
- Will FINISH and launch Institutional Strategy *SOON* (!), focusing on providing guidance and assistance and tools for faculty

- Realize that keeping up with proper processes, and allowances/eligibility, can be challenging (including using/interpreting our tools)
- Now with Tri-Agencies "Principles-based Accounting", we do not have special NSERC/SSHRC "books" anymore to say what research expenses are eligible and which aren't ...

- When research accounts ("funds" more correctly in SMU "FOAP" language) are setup for faculty's internal or external grants/contracts/conference funding: there is always an "expiry date"
 - Accounts established for specific purposes, and can't be maintained indefinitely nor "mixed" with other influxes of money
 - Accounts not designed for use like "bank accounts" for saving for future use, rather are designed for specific intent and purpose
 - Normally you will be given the expiry when account setup, or (for older accounts) be notified of impending closure.

Update on Faculty Web-Profile & CV Tool

- As has been evident for last ~3-5 years, the old "SMUcv" tool to enter Faculty CV info, and automatically generate WebProfiles become non-functional
- During 2020-21, we identified a good replacement platform that is in use successfully at several other Canadian universities
- IMPLEMENTATION UNDERWAY: tool called "UniWeb" (from company *Proximify*). Project started = a year and half ago...
- Project team still steadily moving forward, working with Proximify coordinating our "release/launch" with new version of UniWeb release ("UniCloud") ... I had high hopes ... I am worried that the project is now 6-8 months behind plan ... More info as we launch.


