

THE FATHER WILLIAM A. STEWART, S.J., MEDAL FOR EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING NOMINATION DOSSIER

Criteria: This award is open to current full-time faculty members who have completed at least five years of full-time teaching service at Saint Mary's University and have made significant contributions to the education of Saint Mary's students through excellence in teaching and service. Faculty members must be full-time since January 2015 or earlier in order to be considered for this award.

The Selection Committee will consider candidates who:

- a) Demonstrate teaching ability and classroom performance
- b) Demonstrate capacity to engage learner interest in the subject
- c) Develop and clearly communicate student learning outcomes, course requirements, and pathways to success
- d) Use approaches to teaching and evaluation of learning that respect diverse student learning needs
- e) Demonstrate active, experiential learning in and outside the classroom
- f) Demonstrate reflective teaching, for example by
 - › engaging in the scholarship of teaching and learning- sharing good practice with others through workshops, presentations, or publications on teaching and learning
 - or*
 - › participating in professional development activities to enhance teaching practice

Nomination: Members of the Saint Mary's University Alumni Association, University employees, and students may submit a Nomination Dossier, which should make a persuasive case using evidence from a variety of sources, including the candidate, students, peers, former students and teaching materials.

Nomination Dossier: To promote consistency and fairness, submissions must be compiled in the given order on a maximum of 18 numbered pages, single-spaced in 12-point font with standard 1" margins. In addition to the attached Nomination Form (*max. 1 page*), the Nomination Dossier must include:

1. **A letter from the primary nominator, illustrating the candidate's major strengths** (*max. 3 pages*).
2. **A letter of reference from a Saint Mary's colleague** (*max. 2 pages*).
3. **A letter of reference from a former student who has participated in a course offered by the professor within the past five years** (*max. 2 pages*).
4. **A letter of reference from a former student** (*optional, no timeline restriction, max. 2 pages*).
5. **A Curriculum Vitae prepared by the candidate** (*max. 8 pages*), to include **a)** a teaching philosophy statement, **b)** highlights of major academic career achievements in teaching, service and research, **c)** a list of all courses taught at Saint Mary's over the past five years, and **d)** information from student evaluations of teaching, to be submitted on the attached template.

Note: All letters should describe the candidate's impact on Saint Mary's University and its students, and letters from students who are enrolled in courses taught by the candidate **will not be accepted.**

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Selection: Previous winners of this award are ineligible for re-nomination. Previous candidates may be re-nominated. Previous nominations can be re-submitted for consideration for up to two years after the nomination is first received. Following the two year time period, a new Nomination Dossier would need to be submitted.

The Selection Committee will include at least three members of the Saint Mary's University Alumni Association, one member of the Saint Mary's University Students Association, and one current Saint Mary's University Faculty member. Members of the Committee may be substituted in the event of conflicts of interest, including current working or teacher-student relationships, or previous support of the nomination of any of the current year's candidates.

The Committee reserves the right to withhold the award in any year where nominations do not meet criteria/eligibility standards. The deadline for nominations is March 27, 2020. We are unable to accept incomplete/late submissions.

Timeline: The nomination period will run from **February 3, 2020 to March 27, 2020.**
