NEWS ABOUT OUR PROJECT

Evie Tastsoglou and Lori Wilkinson completed an invited **chapter**, based on the GBV-MIG project data, entitled "*Gender-Based Violence and Citizenship in a Migration Context*". The book's editor is Mary Romero and Reshawna Chapple and the title of the volume is "*Research Handbook on Intersectionality*" published by Elgar.

In addition, the **GBV-MIG project was presented** in the Canadian Sociological Association conference on May 17th at the panel *Gender and the Continuum of Violence in Migration* organized by Evangelia Tastsoglou, Pallabi Bhattacharyya, and Cathy Holtmann. The GBV-MIG team's presentation was titled: *A Journey from "Victimization" to "Re-Victimization" Among Women Migrating to Canada – Continuity of Gender-Based Violence across Borders* (Pallabi Bhattacharyya, Evangelia Tastsoglou, and Cathy Holtmann). Three GBV-MIG **papers** from various country specific teams were presented in this session overall. The research team is very thankful to the immigrant and refugee women, the service providers and other key informants, as well as all the team members for their respective contributions in these projects.

We are also continuing recruitment of migrant and refugee women survivors of GBV as well as with the frontline workers. Recruitment posters can be found at the end of this newsletter. 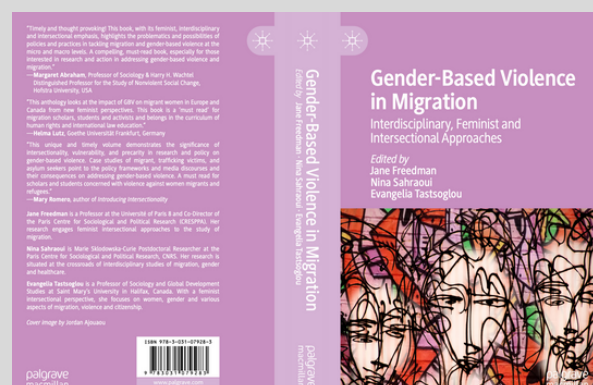

Some of these findings have been used to change national immigration policies, inform governments internationally, and have helped introduce new programming in the immigration community.

WAR IN UKRAINE

A crisis for women and girls

GBV IN FOCUS

UN Women

Women and girls are specially impacted, as social cohesion, community security, and access to social services are restricted.

Ukrainian Refugees

It is estimated that 90% of the millions of people who have fled Ukraine are women and children.

Gender-Based Violence

Huge numbers of women and girls have suffered conflict-related sexual violence by invading soldiers.

Risks of Human Trafficking

UNHCR recognizes that due to the gender profile of Ukrainian Refugee influx and the fact that many children have fled alone, the risks of gender-based violence, trafficking, abuse, psychological trauma and family separation are now greater. UNHCR warns refugees on the risks of predators who may attempt to exploit their vulnerability.

UN Women Rapid Gender Analysis (RGA)

The key findings show that while women are at the forefront of the humanitarian response, they are not fully involved in decision-making. In addition, the impacts of war are disproportionate to internally displaced people and marginalized groups such as female-headed households, the Roma community, persons with disabilities and LGBTQIA+ people. In other words, the crisis is largely exacerbating pre-existing gender and intersectional inequalities and discrimination. Incidents of gender-based violence, particularly domestic violence and conflict-related sexual violence, are increasing, but the required support and services for survivors are not adequate.

Women Soldiers

In the resistance against the Russian invasion, Ukrainian women played crucial roles, such as soldiers.

As of 2018, Ukrainian women have the same legal status as men in the military. Recently, women make nearly 25% of the armed forces.

MIGRANT WOMEN CONTINUE TO FACE ABORTION ACCESS BARRIERS

Migrant women in Canada face profound barriers in accessing healthcare, especially when it comes to abortion. It is common to hide the pregnancy, for fear of getting fired or not being hired in the next season. Many women live on their employers' property in the rural areas, where access to abortion is already scarce. Limitations such as transportation and its costs, language barrier, and fear of losing one's job make it difficult to access the Healthcare System.

AMERICAS SUMMIT ENDS WITH IMMIGRATION DEAL

On June 10th, twenty countries in the Americas, including Canada, signed the Los Angeles Declaration committing to help and protect all migrants, refugees, asylum-seekers and stateless persons. Canada commits \$27M and includes a promise to welcome 4,000 more migrants from Latin America by 2028.

UK PLANS TO SEND REFUGEES TO RWANDA

On June 14th, The European Court of Human Rights (ECHR) halted the inaugural flight of a controversial UK Government scheme.

The UK government released their "UK and Rwanda migration and economic development partnership" in April as the "World's first partnership to tackle global migration crisis". The proposal has led to recriminations from human rights groups and advocacy groups had initiated multiple legal challenges to stop the plane. Experts - from activists to politicians - have argued that this plan is a 21st-century imperialism as richer countries are furthering their own geopolitical interests when sending refugees to low-income countries. Despite all controversies, Britain is continuing to move ahead with the Rwanda deportation plan. UNHCR remains firmly opposed to these arrangements, describing them as shifting asylum responsibilities and evading international obligations that are contrary to the letter and spirit of the Refugee Convention.
