

Twenty Years of TAN

arewell ssue

THIS IS THE FAREWELL ISSUE OF TAN. LAUNCHED in 1981, and now 20 years "old," TAN is being

There are two reasons for retirement. The first is financial. Escalating postal rates and an increasing number of subscribers have combined to make the costs of producing and distributing two issues of TAN per year approach \$3000. This cost has been borne entirely by the Department of Anthropology at Saint Mary's University,

and it is a cost that the Department can no longer bear - even with the frequent cost-cutting measure of producing a single, combined issue per year. The alternative, charging a subscription fee, would be expensive and cumbersome to administer and would reduce the number of subscribers to a point where production of TAN would

not be worthwhile.

The second, and happier, reason is that, since its inception 20 years ago, the need for TAN has declined, because the number of other publications and organizations promoting precollege anthropology has increased. Since 1981, the American Anthropological Association and affiliated sections such as the Council on Anthropology and Education, General An-


thropology Division, and Society for Anthropology in Community Colleges have all launched, or revived, precollege and teaching anthropology initiatives. To these can be added initiatives of the Society for Historical Archaeology, Society for American Archaeology, and United States National Parks Service, as well as the National Center for Science Education and the Smithsonian Institution, which publishes TAN's "sister" American newsletter AnthroNotes. A multitude of precollege anthropology resources is now available. > TAN has been published with the expert help of numerous individuals. Department of Anthropology secretaries, including current secretary Monica Lewis, have served as circulation managers. Anthropology faculty members Michelle Daveluy, Stephen Davis, James Jaquith, Harold McGee, Jr., and Susan Walter have supported the

newsletter and approved funds for its design, printing, and mailing. In the early years, TAN was designed and printed "in house" at Saint Mary's University, but for many years it has been designed and printed at Dalhousie University, where the talented staff at Dal Graphics have been responsible for the steady improvement of its appearance.

As editor of TAN, I release myself from my duties with some regret but mainly with the confidence that

TAN has served its purpose and can retire with pride. Finally, I thank all subscribers for their support and wish them well in all their precollege anthropology endeavors. They can still contact me at anthropology@stmarys.ca.


