Applications

The deadline for applications is December 15

Requirements

Our programs are quite competitive, with high grades, research experience (including conference and journal publications), and fit with our faculty research interests being the priority factors assessed at admission.

Applicants are encouraged to show clearly how their research fits with our faculty in their area of application in their letter of intent. While applicants do not need to secure a research supervisor to apply, demonstrating connection and mutual research interests with our faculty in your letter of intent/ personal statement, will improve chances of acceptance.

Our graduate programs no longer require GRE scores to apply.

Scholarships

We offer graduate scholarships to most candidates who receive an offer of admission, and encourage all to apply for additional external scholarships (SSHRC, Nova Scotia Graduate Scholarships, Scotia Scholar Award, CIHR).

Prerequisites

The minimum Grade Point Average to apply is the equivalent of 3.3/4.3 (in the Canadian system), while the average of the students we offer admission is typically around 3.9/4.3.

MSc in Applied Psychology program Industrial/Organizational and Forensic Psychology streams

You should have an honours undergraduate degree in psychology or equivalent (which usually means a directed research course supervised by faculty and advanced quantitative course/s). Your undergraduate program also needs to have included a minimum of 60 credit hours of psychology coursees.

PhD in Industrial/Organizational (I/O) Psychology

You should normally have previously completed an honours undergraduate degree in psychology, and a masters degree in I/O Psychology or a highly related field with an empirical masters thesis.
